## Professional Development Program

Madonna University offers a program to assist administrators, teachers, and other education professionals in earning graduate credit toward their professional development requirement by attending and reflecting upon pre-approved workshops, conferences, and seminars over and above their job. **The professional development must be a learning experience that adds to your professional growth.**

Participants in this program may earn one hour of graduate credit for every 15 actual clock hours of course attendance at pre-approved workshops, conferences, and seminars at the local, state or national level. While these 15 hours do not need to cover the same activity or topic, they must all be related to the educator's professional growth. For example, the educator could accrue 8¼ clock hours of credit for attending a local workshop and another 7 clock hours for attending a state or national conference, for a total of 15¼ clock hours. This would qualify for one hour of graduate credit, and the educator would have an additional ¼ hour to apply toward the accrual of the next 15 actual clock hours. Homework, breaks, lunch hours and communication time with classmates do not count toward credit. Credit for the Professional Development Program courses is on a pass/fail system.

Papers must be submitted by the end of the second semester after registration. For example, if you register for a Fall Madonna course, you will have to submit your work no later than the end of Winter semester (April 1<sup>st</sup>) to receive credit.

### Deadline to submit papers for all academic years:

Fall course: April 1

Winter course: August 1

Spring/Summer course: December 1

The tuition for the Professional Development Program is \$150 per graduate credit hour. Payment in full is due at the time of registration. Tuition is nonrefundable.
