

Admission

Admission into the University is based upon the merit and academic credentials (i.e. college preparation, grade point average, and/or standardized test scores) of each student.

Students who meet the regular admission standard, but who don't have the required TOEFL, IELTS or MELAB scores will receive conditional admission. These students will be required to successfully complete English as a Second Language (ESL) program before receiving regular admission.

The campus is conveniently located on 50 wooded acres in Livonia, Michigan — ranked one of the safest cities in the United States. Madonna is surrounded by free, well-lit parking and offers easy access to major freeways, and to downtown Detroit, Detroit Metro Airport, Ann Arbor, Canada and Northern Ohio.

Academic Support Services

Academic support services help students succeed in their classes, i.e., writing assistance, computer software, skill building and tutoring. Offices include:

Athletics

Madonna University athletic teams compete in: men's baseball, basketball, cross-country, golf, and soccer, and women's basketball, cross-country, golf, soccer, softball, and volleyball. The teams have earned many conference championships since the athletic program began in 1987.

Diversity

Madonna enrolls more than 3,000 undergraduate students and 1,000 graduate students from the United States and over 40 other countries. Furthermore, Detroit and Ann Arbor offer rich cultural experiences. Chicago and Toronto are only a few hours away. While Madonna is a Catholic university, we welcome people of all faiths, and of varied social and economic backgrounds.

ESL Program

In our intensive ESL program, students receive 30 classroom contact hours of English instruction per week. Students are able to raise their skills in speaking, reading and writing English to the level necessary to succeed in college.

Franciscan Center for Science and Media

The Franciscan Center provides the University's growing science programs with state-of-the-art laboratories. Its digital, high-definition production studios and editing facilities meet the high technical demands of the broadcast and cinema arts program. The building also houses classrooms, a lecture hall, and a student gathering area. The building's many "green" features include low e glass, recycled materials, motion sensitive lighting and a sedum-covered roof area.



High-Speed Internet Service on Campus

The University maintains several computer labs for student use: PC and Macintosh computer labs, a computer classroom, and a collaborative multimedia computer lab that supports art and graphic design, video,

and journalism. The campus wireless network enables Internet and e-mail access throughout the academic buildings, and residence hall.

Residence Hall

The University Center residence hall includes gathering areas on each floor, attractive suite areas, and kitchenettes. Each room has internet, cable TV and telephone connections, and twenty rooms are equipped with emergency lighting systems for the hard of hearing. Throughout the year, the lounges, commons, and spacious dining halls are used for gatherings, dances, speaking events, and workshops, as well as student government and club meetings. The roof-covered patio and the upper and lower terraces afford a view of the tree-lined pond and landscape.

International Students Office (ISO)

Bilingual ISO staff members help students understand the admission requirements for international students and F-1 student status. The staff also assists with orientation, advising and coordination of extracurricular and cultural exchange activities.
