REVIEW ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

First-year Applicant

High school senior, recent, or past high school graduate who has earned a high school diploma or GED

- Cumulative high school GPA of 2.75 or above
- ACT composite score of 20 or above
- Pre-nursing requires grades of C (2.0) or above in algebra, chemistry and biology

Transfer Applicant

Current or past college/university student

- Cumulative GPA of 2.0 or above
- Completion of two-thirds of all courses attempted
- Good academic and personal standing at previous institutions
- Pre-nursing requires 2.5 GPA and grades of C (2.0) or higher in algebra, chemistry and biology

Complete the undergraduate admission application

Visit madonna.edu > Future Students. Create your account by providing your name, e-mail address, and a password. Complete the application, and follow the directions below.

First-year Applicant

Send the following official documents directly to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions:

- Official high school transcripts
- Official ACT or SAT test scores if taken within last two years (ACT code: 020220, SAT: 1437)
- Personal essay (include: areas of interest, honors, and desire to attend Madonna University)
- If applicable, official Advanced Placement (AP) scores

Transfer Applicant

Send the following official documents directly to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions:

- Official transcripts from current and/or all previously-attended post-secondary institutions
- If applicable, official Advanced Placement (AP) scores and/or CLEP scores
- If fewer than 24 semester hours of transferable credits, see First-year Applicants

Post-Baccalaureate Students (Second Degree)

Send all official transcripts to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions. These will assist in the development of your academic plan of study. Only the official transcripts of your bachelor's degree are required for admission.

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Complete the FAFSA after January 1, and before state deadline of March 1. The FAFSA determines your eligibility for all need-based and non-need-based federal and state grants, scholarships, loans, and work-study. **Madonna University's federal school code is 002282.**
