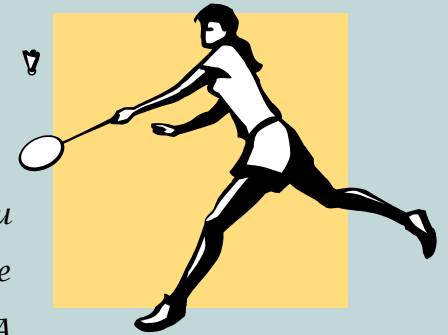
Meet our ISO Student Staff!
