

Why should I consider taking a CLEP exam?

The [College Level Examination Program \(CLEP\)](#) offers exams in five subject areas, covering material taught in courses that students generally take in their first two years of college. Most CLEP exams are designed to correspond to one-semester courses; some correspond to full-year or two-year courses.

What are the CLEP exams like?

The exams are: approximately 90 minutes long; made up primarily of multiple-choice questions, although some include essays, and language exams include listening sections; administered on a computer, so you receive your scores immediately after you finish.

Who do I contact for further information and to register to take an exam?
