

What is ACTFL's AAPPL Assessment?

[Description taken from the AAPPL website linked below.] The ACTFL Assessment of Performance toward Proficiency in Languages (AAPPL) is a web-based proficiency and performance assessment of K-12 standards-based language learning. It assesses language ability across the three modes of communication as defined by the World-Readiness Standards for Learning Languages. Tasks on the AAPPL are often situated within the context of today's communication media. For example, test takers perform tasks such as answering questions posed by a video chat partner, reading social media posts, and e-mailing a pen pal to demonstrate language ability.

AAPPL is available in Arabic, Chinese (Mandarin), English, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Portuguese, Russian, and Spanish. [ACTFL AAPPL Assessment Website](#)

To be eligible for course credit, students must complete Form B2 with a score of I-5 or A-1.
