

Why should I submit my International Baccalaureate (IB) results?

The International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme offers academically challenging courses in a broad range of subject areas. If you completed IB coursework in high school, your results may qualify you to receive college credit, allowing you to build on what you have already learned and potentially save time and tuition as you work toward your degree.

How does IB credit work?

IB Diploma Programme courses are offered at Standard Level (SL) and Higher Level (HL). Students receive a final grade for each IB course on a scale of 1 to 7, with 7 being the highest. College credit may be awarded based on the subject, level, and score earned, according to the University's established IB equivalencies. You do not need to have earned the full IB Diploma to have individual IB courses considered for college credit.

How do I receive credit for my IB results?

Review the IB equivalency chart below to see how your IB scores may translate into college credit. If you have earned an eligible score, simply request that your official IB results be sent to the University. Once received, eligible credit will be added to your academic record based on the equivalencies listed below.

Current IB students may ask their school's IB coordinator to have their results sent to the University. If your results have already been released, you may request that an official transcript be sent directly to the University through the International Baccalaureate Request for Results service.
