Audience: This workshop is designed for students, interpreters, and the general public.

Presenter Information: Jodee Crace graduated with a M.A. in School Counseling from Gallaudet University in 1988. Since then she has utilized her counseling degree and additional interdisciplinary studies in a variety of human development field as a staff therapist at a Community Mental Health Center, as a school counselor and then as the Early Intervention Coordinator at the Indiana School for the Deaf. Currently, she provides consulting, coaching, and training services in the area of Early Education and Family Support. She is a National Deaf Mentor Trainer and a state Parent Advisor Trainer, in which both professions utilize the SKI-HI Curriculums. Additionally, Jodee is an adjunct instructor with Gallaudet University's online (and formerly hybrid) certification program of Deaf and Hard of Hearing Infants, Toddlers, and Families Collaboration and Leadership. Most noteworthy is that Jodee is a member of the Joint Committee on Infant Hearing, representing Council on Education of Deaf, as well as being the president-emeritus of the American Society for Deaf Children.

<u>Workshop Description:</u> This workshop will outline common parent support (once their baby is identified as deaf through the medical system), leading to how deaf children acquire healthy social-emotional outcomes. It takes a village to raise a child; therefore, this workshop will provide social-emotional expectations and how you can foster these outcomes, supporting the parents and the deaf child.

Educational Objectives:

Participate will:

- 1. Discover what existing systems and resources are available and appropriate to support parents in their early journey of parenting their deaf child(ren).
- 2. Build existing knowledge base on what constitutes a healthy deaf person through common theories and best practices in early childhood (birth to 5th grade) with deaf children.
- 3. Brainstorm strategies that will foster healthy social-emotional development and growth when associating (teaching and supporting) with deaf children, based on the first two outcomes.
