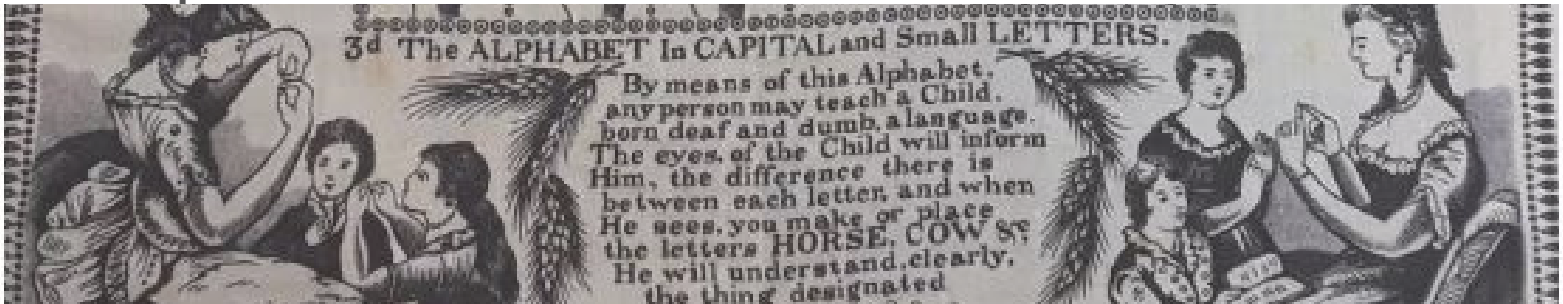


# Analysis on the Difference: Facts Or Myths in Deaf History and Cultures

In 1989, she graduated from Model Secondary School for the Deaf (MSSD) in D. C. She also has completed Bachelor of Science degree in Business Management with University of Phoenix in 2006. Currently, she is now in the Graduate program with Goucher College focusing on Cultural Sustainability Studies. With her Deaf Studies and History of Deaf Education research, consulting, and writing skills, she can lend support!
