Applying to Madonna

Our application is free online. You can find it at madonna.edu/apply. After you submit the application, transcripts, and test scores, be sure to set up a tour of campus with an admissions officer!

2021-2022 FAFSA Opens October 1, 2020

Use Madonna Code: 002282

Apply for financial aid consideration using the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

- Obtain your FSA ID username and password at **studentaid.gov** (parents may also need a separate FSA ID username and password).
- Apply online at www.fafsa.gov between October 1, 2020 and March 1, 2021 (recommended) for the fall semester. Please be sure to list Madonna Code 002282 first.
- Stay informed watch for more information from the Office of Financial Aid.

The FAFSA asks for information about you (name, date of birth, address, etc.) and about your financial situation. Depending on your circumstances, you might need the following:

- Social Security Number
- Alien Registration Number (if you are not a U.S. citizen)
- Recent federal income tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned; bank statements and records of investments (if applicable)
- Records of child support (if applicable)
- Records of untaxed income (if applicable)

IRS DATA RETRIEVAL - When you apply online, you will be given the option to retrieve your IRS data to automatically populate the FAFSA. This option simplifies the application process, helps reduce errors, and lowers your chances of being selected for verification of the information on your FAFSA.

To take advantage of this feature, you'll need to complete your taxes first. It will take approximately two weeks for your taxes to be processed. After this time, you should be able to retrieve this information to automatically populate the corresponding questions on the FAFSA. For the 2021-22 FAFSA, you must use 2019 income information.

It Pays to File Early

No matter your individual state or school filing deadline, the sooner you file the FAFSA after **October 1** each year (the date that the federal processor begins accepting applications), the better!

The FAFSA can be submitted after **October 1, 2020** for the 2021-22 academic year. The State of Michigan deadline to complete the FASFA is **March 1, 2021.**

Review Financial Aid Options

^{*}The federal government pays interest on subsidized loans until last enrollment, less than half-time enrollment, or graduation. Loans are eligible for a six-month grace period. You can choose to pay on the principal of the loan or have it deferred while enrolled.

Student Profile #1

Kaitlyn, a community college transfer student enrolled as a full-time student in the Nursing program at Madonna University. She is familyoriented and is very close to her grandparents. When her grandmother became ill, she discovered she has a passion to care for older adults and wants to work in a health care environment.



Kaitlyn has a 3.60 GPA and is transferring in 26 credit hours. Her mother is an at-home mom, taking care of Kaitlyn's two younger brothers, while her father owns a prominent commercial construction company. The estimated family contribution as determined by the FAFSA needs analysis was \$20,080.

The estimated family contribution as determined by the FAFSA needs analysis was \$12,557. Jason will be a full-time student living on campus and will play basketball for the university. Upon graduation from high school, he had a 3.43 cumulative GPA and a composite ACT score of 25.

Undergraduate tuition is a flat rate based on 15 credit hours for full-time students (full-time status is 12-18 credit hours). Students enrolled in 1-11 credit hours are charged \$800 per credit hour.

Undergraduate nursing courses are an additional \$110 per credit hour.

Accept Aid | myFinancialaid Portal

Once you have been accepted to Madonna, applied for FAFSA, and your Madonna Financial Aid package has been created, you can go online to review your package and send in any additional materials.

Go to **madonna.edu/tuition-and-financial-aid**. Click "My Financial Aid". Set up your account using the "First Time User" feature. Follow prompts to create the profile.

Once the profile has been accessed, click on upper left menu button and then click "Accept Awards". On this screen all awards can be accepted or declined. Awards must be accepted or declined to complete the Financial Aid Package for disbursement.
